

4. Green Room


We're only in week 6 and it is amazing to see the progression students have made in their learning. We have been busy little mathematicians, engaging with lots of hands-on resources to build our number sense. The Kinders are crazy about numbers and take any opportunity they can to practise counting and recording numbers to ten. This week we have been learning all about 2D shapes. Students have been using a range of materials to build their understanding, such as 2D shape blocks, technology and puzzles.

Our focus text this week is Edward the Emu and the Year 2 students have been writing compound and complex texts in response to the text. The Kinder students have been learning what a sentence is and producing oral sentences with a who (noun) and a do (verb). We learn new vocabulary with each focus text to improve reading comprehension. Our new words for Edward the Emu are impressive, amusing and detest. Students have been using these in their writing and conversations which is fantastic!

Gold Room Newsletter


Throughout the past fortnight in the Gold Room, we have been busy learning many different topics. Our focus in Literacy has been learning about Persuasive Writing. We have discussed and debated many subjects, including "Dogs are better than cats", "The city is the best place to live", "Books are better than movies" and a key focus on writing about the topic "Summer is better than Winter".

Students had to brainstorm ideas and choose 'for' or 'against' the topics. We then verbally debated and rebutted each other's points and facts to the opposite side. Some students were swayed to join the different side of the argument due to the very persuasive language and ideas shared! We are now practicing our persuasive writing and how to form texts that are high quality in persuading either 'for' or 'against' the topic.

We are continuing to strengthen our fluency and reading skills, as we read in our Reading Pairs first thing in the mornings for 10 minutes. Everyone is also doing an excellent job with using the SMART Spelling Program/ InitiaLit Program and the coinciding spelling lists during our spelling lessons, weekly spelling tests and homework spelling lists.

Mathematics has been focusing on Division and Multiplication for Year 3 and Year 4. Our rapid recall is being challenged daily, focussing on a times-table the students feel they are not 100% confident with yet. We are then using our times-tables knowledge to convert and cross-check when using division.

Our Year 6 are focussing on fractions, decimals and percentages. We are learning difference strategies to convert fractions, decimals and percentages, as well as add and subtract fractions. We have also been learning about different data collecting strategies and different graphs used to order the data. We created bar, dot, plot, pie and tally graphs to collate data and understand how to process data collection.



6. P&C Meeting

Many thanks to those who attended our first P&C Meeting for this year. Minutes from this meeting have been sent home.

The P&C AGM will be held prior to or General P&C Meeting on Monday 13th March @ 7:30pm in the school Library.

Nominations for executive positions will be taken from the floor on the night or in writing prior to the meeting.

It will be important for each family to have a member at these meeting as we have the Gerogery Festival on March 25 & 26 to discuss.

For the remainder of this term sport will be cricket skills at school every Friday. Students should wear school sports uniform and wear runners on these days.
