

11. Gold Room – Week 6-10 Term 2 Ms Curnow




In the Gold Room, we have been learning all about Genre in Literacy! We have been studying the text Deadly Science – Wild Weather. Students have focused on understanding Informative text types, hybrid texts (fiction and non-fiction), and finding factual statements. We have been practicing notetaking, summarising and finding key notes in texts. To finish this Literacy Unit all about Genre, students have designed an Information Presentation focused on an extreme weather event. This has been a wonderful link to science learning too, as we have learned all about Australian weather patterns and wild weather.

In Maths, we have learned all about Fractions and Data & Statistics! Students have explored the link between Fractions and Decimals. We have made our own number lines and labelled this with fraction strips. Students also conducted a school wide survey that was about the topic of Sport. The Green Room joined us to have a wider range of votes and expand our data collection. Students have learned all about different types of graphs and how to display data. We have also completed Essential Assessments to finish our Semester 2 of Maths learning.




In Science, we have been learning all about Energy! Students have explored different types of energy, focusing on Renewable Energy. We have learned the differences between finite and
